Cambodia



Cambodia is a constitutional monarchy in South-east Asia with a population of more than 13 million people. A citizen of Cambodia is usually identified as Cambodian. Most Cambodians are Theravada Buddhists of Khmer extraction, but the country also has a substantial number of Cham and small hill tribes.

The country shares a border with Thailand to its west, with Laos to its north, with Vietnam to its east, and with the Gulf of Thailand to its south

Persecution in Cambodia reached its most terrifying pitch in the 1970s at the hand of Pol Pot's brutal Khmer Rouge. The Khmer Rouge committed auto genocide against an estimated 1.7 million Cambodians who were in some way deemed to be "enemies of the state", whether they were linked to the previous regime, civil servants, people of education or of religion, critics of the Khmer Rouge or Marxism, or simply offered resistance to the brutal treatment of the cadres. Hundreds of thousands more fled across the border with neighboring Thailand whose government nonetheless helped to support the Khmer Rouge. Cambodian Christians learned to make themselves invisible.

Today, still, Christians are afraid to take leadership positions or to share their faith publicly. Pol Pot is dead, but the fear he incited lives on. Cambodia's government espouses religious freedom, but Christians still face persecution.

Pray that our broadcasts from Guam and the local broadcasts of TWR will have a great impact on the land of Cambodia.

"I live in Prey Konseak Village, Oucha Commune, Battambang District, Battambang Province. I would like to thank Trans World Radio that is always concerned about my spiritual needs as well as Cambodian people. In this opportunity, I would like to tell you about how I became a believer. I became a Christian through my son in law. He is a pastor of _____ Church. He is a very good servant to the Lord in serving His ministry. Since I became a Christian, I always meditate, learn, using the word of God to comfort my life. I am blind, I cannot see anything around. I always pray to God to help me to get closer to Him. I am very poor financially but I prayed to be poor spiritually. One day, I overheard God's words on radio from my neighbor's house. I was very hungry to hear His words but I did not have my own radio and cannot walk and find the way to get one. In my village, there are only two or three radios and those radios are so old that they sometimes work and sometimes not.

Thankfully to the Lord our God for His kindness to me, I got one radio from Trans World Radio. I was very excited.

I believed that was the answer from God to me for what I had prayed to Him and He saw what I needed so He sent me that radio. Since I got a radio I found that my heart was relieved from stress and burden. Your programs are helping me improve my faith and always encourage me. Finally may God our Lord bless this ministry in order to help more Cambodian people to know God like me."
