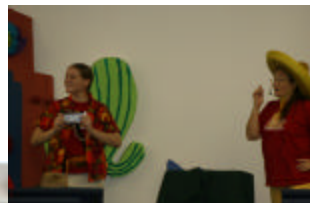

While Carolyn was healing, Dan's father was diagnosed with a brain tumor, Carolyn's mom was given very little time to live and the doctor advised the family to see her soon. Carolyn was unable to travel so this was added stress on her. Carolyn's mother has improved slightly. Pray that her mother will

continue to progress well.

Dan and Carolyn are from one of our supporting churches in Michigan. So, this gives us a chance to get to know them. One of the projects that Dan will be helping with is to make our diesel fuel tank OSHA compliant. They will be making a spill containment that will prevent diesel from going into the ground if there were a leak.

This opened our eyes to a little of what the Apostle Paul faced when he was in Athens on his second missionary journey.
